Tulaine Marshall is a Partner at New Profit Inc. a national venture philanthropy fund that provides growth capital grants and strategic support to social entrepreneurs and their organizations. She has played central leadership roles in the launch of several schools and non-profit organizations domestically and internationally, most notably, Citizen Schools, a nationally recognized educational organization serving middle school students across the country. Tulaine is the Founder and President of New Resource Strategies (NRS), a consulting firm that enables mission-driven organizations to address major operational, fiscal, and strategic challenges. She has served as Vice President of Community Impact with United Way Massachusetts Bay & Merrimack Valley providing strategic vision and leadership in the areas of affordable housing, sustainable employment, asset building, financial education and basic needs. As the National Director of Graduate and Youth Opportunities at YouthBuild USA, Tulaine oversaw a portfolio of initiatives designed to help low- income youth successfully enter college and the 21st century workforce. Tulaine has also worked as the Manager of the National Schools Initiative (NSI) at Youth Build USA funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

Tulaine received a master's degree in Public Policy from Tufts University and earned her B.A. from Smith College in Northampton, MA. She is a Senior Fellow at the Center for Collaborative Leadership at the University of Massachusetts in Boston, a Community Enrichment Fellow at Northeastern University, and a Neighborhood Fellow at Tufts University. She is an Adjunct Professor at Lesley University and serves as Co-Chair of The State of Black Boston, a research and community development initiative that analyzes the social and economic issues affecting Boston's Black population.
